GEORGIA AIMS FOR ELITE FINISH



For the first time since 1980 the Bulldogs are 12-0, and back then, that was good enough for both a Southeastern Conference title and a national championship. In 2021, the Bulldogs are aiming for an elite finish. Three more victories are needed to earn an SEC and a national title.

After blanking Georgia Tech 45-0 last Saturday in Atlanta, Georgia became only the fourth team in school history to finish a regular season undefeated and untied with double-digit victories (1946, 1980, 1982). Top-ranked Georgia (12-0, 8-0 SEC) battles No. 3 Alabama (11-1, 7-1 SEC) in Atlanta for the 2021 SEC crown. The Bulldogs are looking for their 14th conference title, which trails only the Crimson Tide who has tallied 28 in their history.

Georgia has made eight appearances in the SEC Championship Game that began in 1992. The Bulldogs are 3-5 in these contests including 1-2 under Kirby Smart. In Georgia's three victories, the game's most valuable player has been a quarterback twice (David Greene in 2002; DJ Shockley in 2005) and most recently a linebacker (Roquan Smith in 2017).

Georgia enjoyed a dominating three-year stretch from 1980-82 under Vince Dooley when they posted a 33-3 overall mark and a perfect 18-0 record in the SEC. The 2002 SEC Championship was long overdue as the Bulldogs, under Mark Richt, ended a 20-year drought. Richt led the Bulldogs to four more

appearances in the championship game, but the 2005 squad was the only other one to raise another SEC trophy.

Now in the Smart era, Georgia makes its fourth appearance in the big game in the past five years. This season, Georgia registered an 8-0 SEC mark for the first time in school history. The average margin of victory in these games was 31.9 points. For the third time under Smart, Georgia went a perfect 6-0 against teams from the Eastern Division.

Georgia now has completed league play undefeated eight times. The 1959 SEC Champions went 7-0 in the league while the 1946, 1949 and 1966 Bulldog teams went 5-0 in the SEC. The 1980-81-82 Bulldogs all finished SEC play 6-0. The SEC went to an eight-game league slate when it split into divisions in 1992.

Smart and the Bulldogs are now focused on the postseason. First up, it will be the defending SEC and CFP champions.

David Andrews, OL: Played all 60 snaps at center and helped New England accumulate 394 total yards.

J.R. Reed, DB: Tallied six tackles for the Giants.

Andrew Thomas, OL: Played all 60 snaps at tackle and helped New York roll up 264 total yards.

BEARS 16, LIONS 14

Alec Ogletree, OLB: Posted five tackles for Chicago.

Roquan Smith, ILB: Logged three tackles for the Bears before exiting with a hamstring injury. He ranks fourth in the NFL with 113 tackles.

D'Andre Swift, RB: Had three catches for nine yards and three rushes for zero yards before leaving with a shoulder injury. He leads all running backs with 56 receptions and ranks third with 429 yards receiving.

PACKERS 36, RAMS 28

Eric Stokes, DB: Had three tackles and defended two passes for Green Bay. He ranks sixth in the NFL with 11 passes defended.

Leonard Floyd, OLB: Recorded two tackles and a quarterback hurry for Los Angeles.

Sony Michel, RB: Tallied three carries for 14 yards, one catch for 11 yards, and four kickoff returns for 90 yards for the Rams.

Matthew Stafford, QB: Went 21-of-38 for 302 yards and three touchdowns, including a 79-yarder, for Los Angeles. He stands second in the NFL with 27 touchdown passes and third with 3,316 passing yards.

- Top-ranked Georgia is No. 1 nationally in Scoring Defense, allowing just 6.9 points per game, while the offense checks in at No. 6 in Scoring Offense at 40.7 points per game. Alabama ranks fifth nationally in Scoring Offense (42.7 ppg) and 20th in Scoring Defense (19.9 ppg). UA leads the all-time series 41-25-4 including 2-0 in SEC Championship Games.
- For a school record eighth straight week, Georgia is the unanimous No. 1 team in the AP and Coaches polls. The Bulldogs are 4-0 versus ranked teams this year including a pair of top 10 wins.
- The Bulldogs have won 13 SEC titles. Georgia is 3-5 in SEC Championship Game appearances. Under Kirby Smart, the Bulldogs claimed the 2017 SEC title with a 28-7 win over fourth-ranked Auburn while they fell to top-ranked Alabama in 2018 (35-28) and second-ranked LSU (37-10) in 2019.

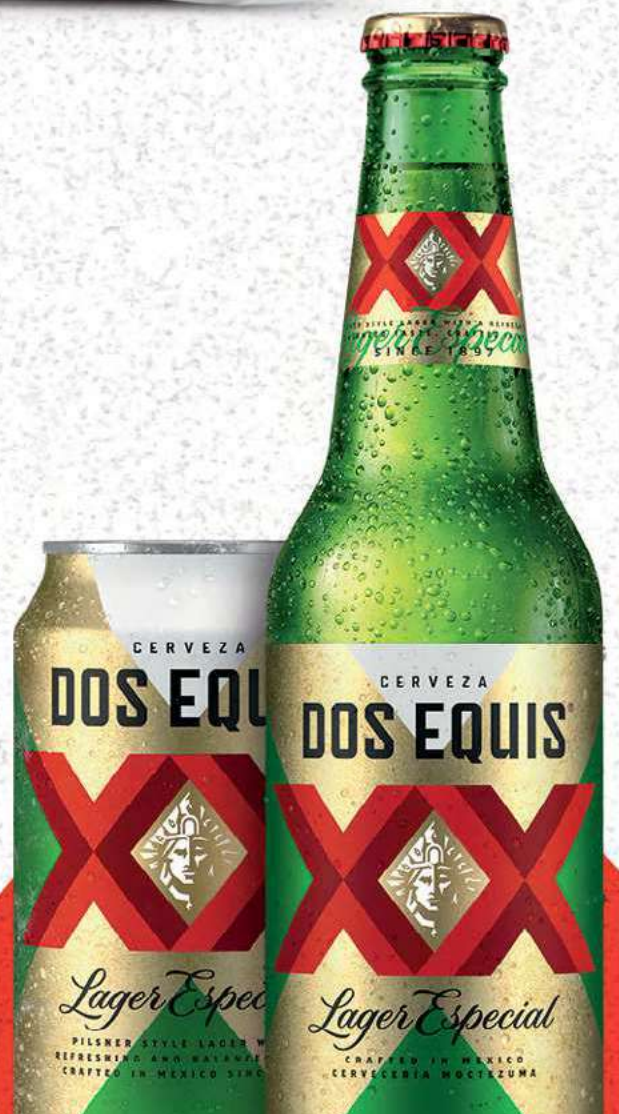

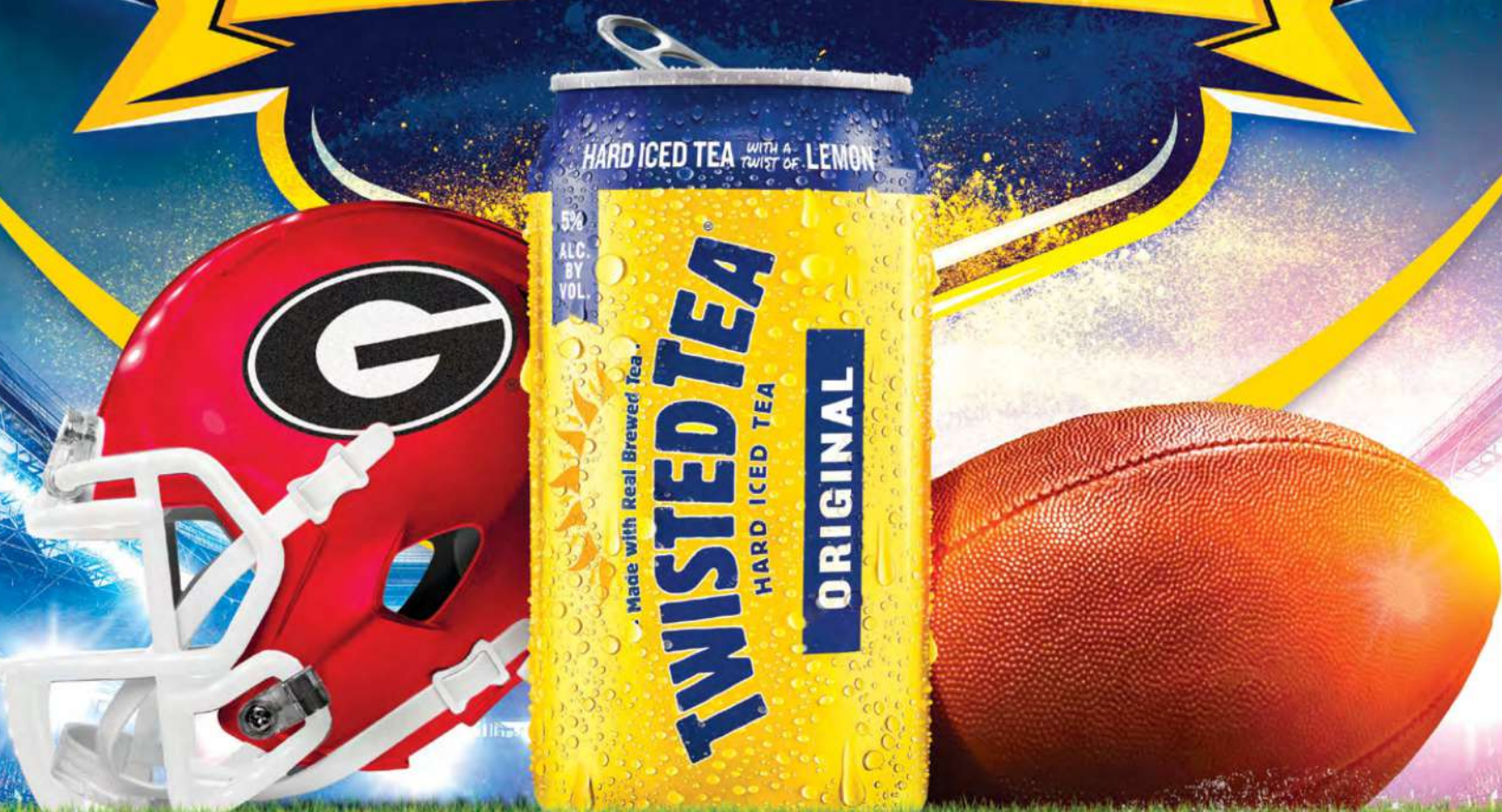

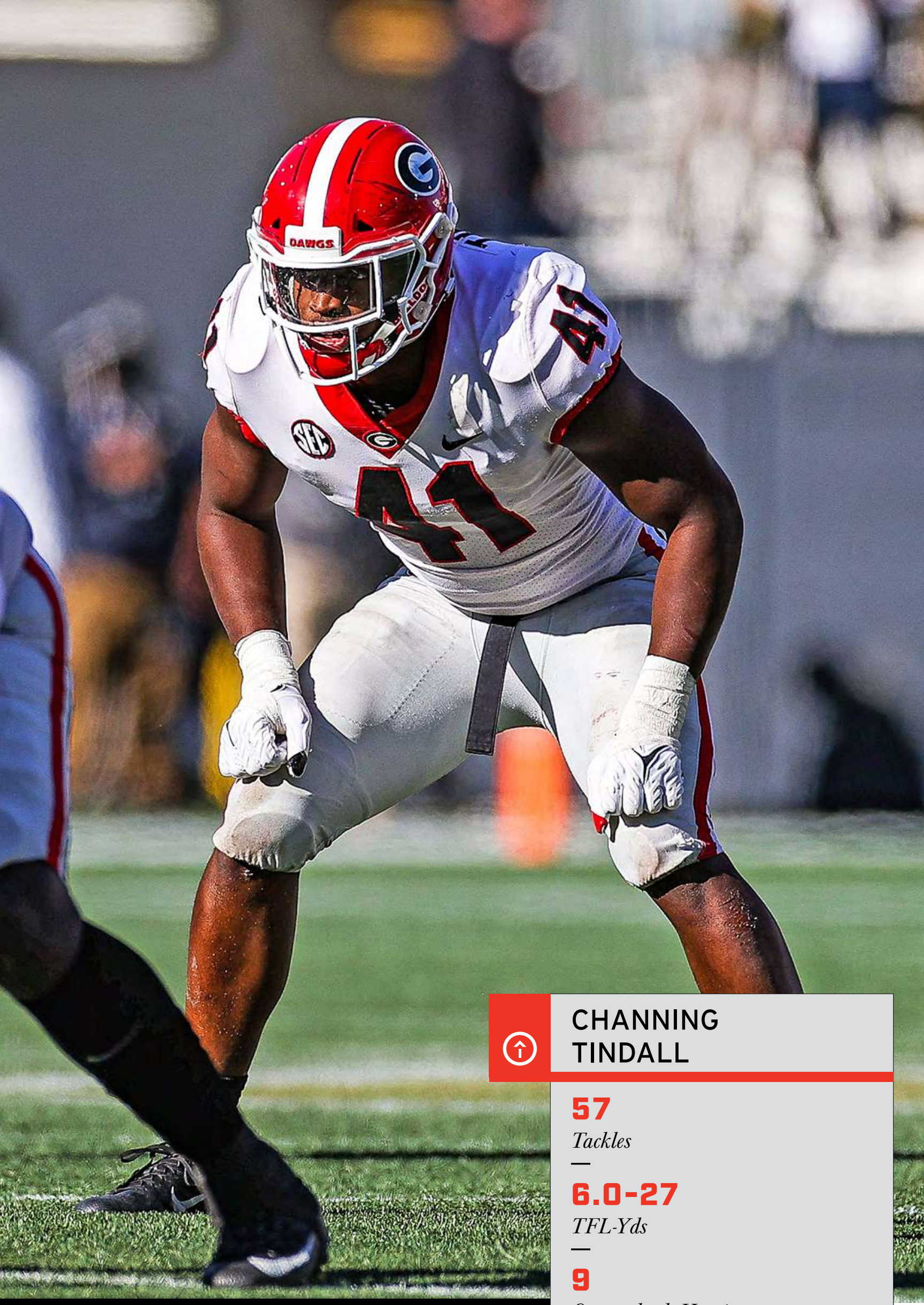
