Did You Know? *The Bulldogs have won a school record 31 consecutive home games dating to 2019, and that is the longest active streak in the FBS. During the streak, Georgia has beaten 10 ranked teams including five ranked in the top 10. Georgia is 50-4 Between the Hedges in the Smart era.*

Playing With FPE (Fire, Passion & Energy)

*One of Georgia's main themes during the preseason and now into 2025 will be to play with "FPE." Fifty-four percent of Georgia's roster is made of players in their first or second seasons in Athens, and they have displayed youthful exuberance throughout spring and fall camp.

Season-Opening Success

*Georgia is 101-27-3 in season openers including 9-0 in the Kirby Smart era. The Bulldogs have won 11 straight openers. The last defeat came in 2013 at #8 Clemson (38-35 over #5 Georgia).

Georgia-Marshall History Features Only 2004 Matchup

*This will be the second meeting between the two schools. Marshall is under the direction of first-year coach Tony Gibson. He replaced Charles Huff who left for Southern Miss shortly after winning the Sun Belt Conference last year. MU entered bowl season with a 10-3 mark and on a seven-game winning streak, but a significant number of players jumped into the portal following Huff's departure, and Marshall pulled out of the Independence Bowl. Gibson's first recruiting class features 61 new players. In 2025, Marshall will wear green helmets, a first since 2009.

*In 2004, Georgia played host to Marshall, and the visitors took an early 3-0 lead on a 33-yard field goal by Ian O'Connor. It was set up by a 57-yard completion from Stan Hill to Emmanuel Spann on the first play from scrimmage. The Bulldog defense would blank the Thundering Herd the rest of the way for a 13-3 win as Marshall managed just 160 yards of offense. David Greene finished 17-for-30 for 209 yards while Thomas Brown gained 81 yards on 18 carries. Michael Cooper scored the lone touchdown while Andy Bailey hit a pair of field goals from 29 and 33 yards. *From 1996-2000, Georgia was led by Jim Donnan who was hired from Marshall. Donnan, a 2009 College Football Hall of Fame inductee, posted a 40-19 record during his Georgia tenure.

Probability and Statistics

*Despite posting an 11-3 mark with an SEC title and advancing to another College Football Playoff, Georgia's offensive and defensive statistics were deemed average by the pundits compared to other top teams last year. However, one should consider the Bulldogs played the nation's toughest schedule per ESPN's FPI with regular season road games at No. 1 Texas, No. 4 Alabama, No. 16 Ole Miss, and in the postseason, they faced No. 2 Texas in Atlanta and No. 5 Notre Dame in the CFP at the Sugar Bowl. Ultimately, here's where the Bulldogs finished in the national rankings.

Scoring Offense: Averaged 31.5 ppg (38th); Scoring Defense: Allowed 20.6 ppg (23rd)

*In the Smart era, the Georgia defense has ended the year ranked in the top five nationally in Scoring Defense five times including leading the nation twice (2019 at 12.6 ppg & 2021 at 10.2 ppg). Also, Georgia was ranked in the final top 10 in Scoring Offense from 2021-23. The Bulldogs were the only FBS team to finish the 2023 season nationally ranked in the top five in both Scoring Offense (40.1 ppg/5th) and Scoring Defense (15.6 ppg/5th).

SMART Football

*Kirby Smart enters his 10th season at the helm of his alma mater with a 105-19 mark. He is one of only two active coaches (Dabo Swinney, Clemson) with multiple national championships. Georgia is the only team in the CFP-era to win back-to-back national titles, doing it in 2021-2022.

*In 2024, the Bulldogs made their fourth straight appearance in the SEC Championship Game (SECCG) and seventh overall trip under Smart. After a 22-19 overtime win over then No. 2 Texas, the Bulldogs claimed their 15th SEC title in school history and the No. 2 seed in the CFP.

*Georgia owns the nation's longest active bowl streak at 28 seasons. Since 2019, the Bulldogs are 7-1 in their past eight bowl/CFP matchups after a CFP quarterfinal loss to #5 Notre Dame in the 2025 Sugar Bowl.

*Georgia is 39-3 against non-conference teams in the Smart era including 22-1 at home. The only losses have been in the 2025 CFP quarterfinal at the Sugar Bowl (#5 Notre Dame 23-10), the 2019 Sugar Bowl (Texas 28-21) and in 2016 in Athens (Ga. Tech 28-27).

Stockton Ranks As The Veteran Signal-Caller

Redshirt junior **Gunner Stockton**, a 6-1, 215-pound native of Tiger, Ga., enters the 2025 season as the veteran quarterback with rookies behind him in redshirt freshmen **Ryan Puglisi** and **Colter Ginn** plus true freshmen **Ryan Montgomery** and **Hezekiah Millender** all preparing for their opportunity.

*Stockton delivered when called upon to start the second half of the 2024 SECCG against Texas who had the No. 1 rated pass defense (No. 3 total defense). He led the Bulldogs on scoring drives of 75, 61 and 72 yards in three of the first four possessions and then the game-winning TD in OT. He finished 12-for-16 for 71 yards and one INT plus had a career-high eight rushes for 19 yards.

*Before the SECCG win over then No. 2 Texas, Stockton was 13-for-16 for 135 yards with two rushing yards on nine attempts last season. He saw action in four games in 2023 and was 12-for-19 for 148 yards and two TDs.

*Stockton made his first career start versus No. 5 Notre Dame in the CFP Quarterfinal Allstate Sugar Bowl on Jan. 2. He was 20-for-32 for 234 yards and a touchdown despite being sacked four times.

"Nate the Great" Frazier Leads Backfield in Second Year

Georgia's top returning running back is 5-10, 205-pound sophomore **Nate Frazier** from Compton, Calif. In 2024, he burst on the scene with 84 yards on 13 carries and a TD in the season-opening win over #14 Clemson. He appeared in 13 games with three starts and led the team with 671 yards and eight TDs. He made his first start in the win over #7 Tennessee and provided 68 yards on 19 carries (tied career high) and one TD. He became the first Bulldog

freshman tailback to start since 2014 when Nick Chubb and Sony Michel both did it. That year, Chubb started eight games while Michel's first career start came in the Belk Bowl win over #20 Louisville. Frazier ran for a career-high 136 yards (most by a Bulldog in '24) and three scores against UMass. Also, he provided the game-winning conversion in OT to beat Ga. Tech 44-42. He has honored some of the Georgia greats of "RBU" with his TD celebrations from Michel's jazz hands to Todd Gurley's signature bow.

*Redshirt freshman **Chauncey Bowens**, the versatile graduate **Cash Jones**, Illinois graduate transfer **Josh McCray** (607 yards and 10 TDs last season), sophomore **Dwight Phillips Jr.**, redshirt sophomore **Roderick Robinson** and freshman **Bo Walker** are aiming to make an impact. Also, the Bell brothers, senior wide receiver **Dillon Bell** (already earned his degree), and his brother **Micah**, who transferred from Vanderbilt where he played DB, are options too.

Top Targets To Keep An Eye On

Last year, the Bulldogs' top targets were seniors Dominic Lovett (59-for-607 yards, 6 TDs) and Arian Smith (48-for-817 yards, 4 TDs) and 2025 senior **Dillon Bell** (43-for-466 yards, 4 TDs). Also, Bell had 107 yards rushing on nine attempts including a 3-yarder for a score at #4 Alabama.

*Other targets this season will include: junior USC transfer **Zachariah Branch** (47 rec., 503 yards, 1 TD in '24) and senior Texas A&M transfer **Noah Thomas** (39 rec., 574 yards, 8 TDs in '24), senior **Colbie Young**, who had 149 yards and two touchdowns in only five contests for UGA last year and junior **London Humphreys** (15 catches for 244 yards and two touchdowns). Also, redshirt freshman **Sacovie White-Helton**, junior **Cole Speer** and first-year receivers **CJ Wiley**, **Talyn Taylor** and **Tyler J. Williams** look to be in the mix plus **Walter Blanchard**, **Thomas Blackshear** and **Landon Roldan**.

New Look O-Line

Georgia was banged up for much of 2024 on the offensive line while facing the nation's toughest schedule per ESPN's FPI. Still, the line helped lead the Bulldogs to another SEC title. This year, the Bulldogs will have a retooled group with All-American Tate Ratledge, OG Dylan Fairchild and C Jared Wilson all getting selected in the 2025 NFL Draft while Xavier Truss (RT) also is in the league after signing as a free agent. Fairchild and Truss were the only ones to start all 14 games last season.

The top candidates in 2025 who made starts last year will be redshirt junior **Drew Bobo** (C) and **Earnest Greene III** (T), redshirt senior **Micah Morris** (G) and junior **Monroe Freeling** (T). The longest starting streak among offensive players belongs to Freeling at five games. The rotation up front may include redshirt freshman **Daniel Calhoun** (G/T) freshman **Juan Gaston Jr.** (G/T), **Bo Hughley** (T/G), sophomore **Jahzare Jackson** (T), redshirt sophomore **Jamal Meriweather** (G), freshmen **Cortez Smith** (C/G) and **Dontrell Glover** and redshirt freshman **Michael Umi**.

Did You Know? The only true freshman offensive lineman to start a season opener in the Smart era is Andrew Thomas (RT) in 2017.

*Drew Bobo's dad is the Bulldogs' Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Mike Bobo**. He was a groomsman at Smart's wedding while Drew was a ringbearer.

Delp, Luckie Lead Loaded TE Room

Tight ends always have played a significant role in the Bulldog offense with seven currently in the NFL, and the 2025 group should be no different. Junior **Lawson Luckie** and senior **Oscar Delp** are expected to play the lead roles and redshirt freshmen **Jaden Reddell** and **Colton Heinrich** ready too.

*Luckie was the team's fifth-leading receiver last year with 24 catches for 348 yards and three touchdowns while making seven starts. In the SECCG win over #2 Texas, Luckie provided a highlight on his lone catch and had a key TD-saving tackle following an interception that could've been a game-ending pick-six. Meanwhile, Delp started 10 games and completed 2024 with 21 receptions for 248 yards and four scores.

Did You Know? Luckie is a second generation Bulldog as his father Mike (LB) was part of Bulldog triplets from 1996-98 with uncles Dustin (LB) and Miles (OL).

*Highly-touted freshmen **Ethan Barbour** (6-3, 235) and **Elyiss Williams** (6-7, 255) will be hard to keep off the field whether it's on special teams or with the offense.

Defensive Playmakers at Each Level

Georgia has had 55 players drafted over the past five seasons, including 30 on defense and 11 of those defenders have gone in the first round.

*The 2024 unit ranked 23rd nationally in Scoring Defense (20.6 ppg).

*Did not allow a TD until the fourth game of the year and forced at least one turnover in 12 of 14 games.

*Posted first half shutouts versus #14 Clemson, Tennessee Tech and at #1 Texas and a second half shutout of #7 Tennessee

*Held #16 Ole Miss to 28 points, including five field goals, as they came in averaging 42.1 ppg.

Setting The Tone Up Front

One of the hallmarks of an elite defense is stopping the run, and that starts up front. In 2025, Georgia is replacing a host of seasoned veterans now playing in the NFL like Mykel Williams, Nazir Stackhouse, Warren Brinson and Tyrion Ingram-Dawkins. The time is now for redshirt junior **Christen Miller** and junior **Jordan Hall** to set the tone. Miller started 10 games last year. Hall battled leg injuries, limiting him to six games and has admitted that rehabbing the mental side more than the physical has been the toughest part.

*Along with Miller and Hall, look for redshirt freshmen **Joseph Jonah-Ajoney**, **Nasir Johnson**, **Nnamdi Ogboko**, and **Jordan Thomas**, redshirt sophomore transfer **Josh Horton** (Miami) and freshmen **Elijah Griffin** and **JJ Hanne** to be in the rotation.

Allen Makes Tackles Along with His Fellow 'Backers

Junior **CJ Allen** ranked second in tackles behind Malaki Starks (1st round pick of Baltimore) with 76 while fellow junior **Raylen Wilson** posted 47 stops with seven tackles for loss. Freshmen All-SEC selections **Chris Cole** and **Justin Williams** stepped up last year when 2024 senior Smael Mondon was hurt, and that duo should be even better in 2025. The highlights for this group include:

*Allen made a career-high 10 stops versus Ga. Tech. He had a team-high eight stops and his first career interception against UF. Allen made six stops in the road win over #1 Texas and then seven in the SEC Championship Game.

*Wilson posted a career-high seven tackles against the Gators. Wilson had five tackles, a forced fumble and sack for a loss of 28 yards that led to a change of possession and Georgia's first score in the road win over UK. He was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week.

*Cole and Williams started to make a noticeable impact as the year continued. Cole has elite speed and flexibility to help him cover along with great length. He scooped up a fumble and returned it 28 yards for a TD against UMass. It marked the first scoop and score by a Bulldog since 2020 when ILB Monty Rice did it against #14 Tennessee.

*Junior transfer **Elo MODOZIE** (Army) is predicted to play an immediate role for Georgia's defense after tallying 34 stops, including eight tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks, last year.

*One of the most veteran linebackers, junior **Gabe Harris Jr.**, will anchor another group including redshirt junior **Terrell Foster**, sophomore **Quintavious Johnson**, RFr. **Kris Jones** and freshmen **Darren Ikinagbon**, **Isaiah Gibson**, **Chase Linton**, **Zayden Walker** and **Anthony Kruah**.

Talented Corps Returns in Secondary

Despite losing All-American safety Malaki Starks in the first round of the 2025 NFL Draft, Georgia returns a talented corps in the defensive backfield.

*Senior **Daylen Everette**, the MVP of the SEC Championship Game, emerged last season with a team-high three INTs plus ranked sixth with 58 tackles. He enters 2025 with a team-best 28 consecutive starts.

***KJ Bolden**, who made the 2024 Freshman All-American, ranked fifth on the squad with 59 stops. He was part of the 2024 FAB14 for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award.

*With 33 career games and three starts under his belt, senior **JaCorey Thomas** has provided a steady veteran presence for the newcomers in the secondary.

*Junior DB **Daniel Harris** started the final four games of last season and coupled with transfers **Zion Branch** (USC), **Jaden Harris** (Miami) and **Adrian Maddox** (UAB) and redshirt freshman **Ellis Robinson IV**, this group aims to be among the first to see action with Everette, Bolden Thomas and Harris.

*Also, **Kyron Jones**, **Demello Jones** and **Ondre Evans** will complement first-year DBs **Todd Robinson**, **Rasean Dinkins**, **Jontae Gilbert**, **Dominick Kelly** and **Daniel Okonkwo** in the room.

Did You Know This About the Specialists?

In 2024, Georgia was the only team in the FBS that had its punter (**Brett Thorson**), placekicker (**Peyton Woodring**) and snapper (**Beau Gardner**) named a semifinalist for a national award at their position, and all three are back! Thorson and Gardner were named finalists for the Ray Guy Award and Patrick Mannelly Award, while Woodring was up for the Groza Award.

Are We Punting?

In the **Kirby Smart** era, the Bulldogs have a 63% success rate on 4th Down (81-for-129) with 14 TDs. In 2024, Georgia led the SEC and ranked 16th nationally in 4th Down Conversions at 67% (18-for-27 with 4 TDs).

G'day Mate! Thorson Returns

With elite distance, hang time, placement and a strong coverage unit, All-America punter **Brett Thorson** and the Bulldogs ranked 5th nationally in Net Punting (43.5) in 2024. However in the SEC Championship Game, Thorson's season ended due to a knee injury during a return after a punt. He finished with four punts for a 53.5 average in the game including a 60-yarder. *A native of Melbourne, Australia, Thorson was a 2024 finalist for the Ray Guy Award. Thorson won the fan vote but Eddie Czaplicki (USC) claimed the trophy. USC led the nation in Net Punting at 45.4. In 2024, Thorson averaged 47.6 yards on 42 punts, the second best mark in school history. *His average would've ranked 3rd nationally in 2024, but the NCAA's minimum for leaders is 3.6 punts a game (Min. 47 punts in 13 games).*

*Thorson's career average of 45.6 ranks 2nd best in school history, trailing only Jake Camarda's record mark of 45.8 set from 2018-21.

*Thorson is known for his comedic slant about his lack of playing time because the Bulldogs punted a record low 32 times in 2023 after just 36 punts in 2022 (15 games), the two lowest totals dating to at least 1948.

*Thanks in part to Thorson's punts and the entire punt coverage team including gunners Arian Smith, Dominic Lovett and **Cole Speer**, Georgia was the only team in the FBS that did not allow a punt return in 2023, the first school to do that since 2020 when COVID limited the amount of games teams played. Along with Speer, possible gunners in 2025 include **KJ Bolden**, **London Humphreys**, **Daniel Harris**, **Jeremy Bell** and **Daylen Everette**.

*Georgia had its streak of not allowing a positive yard on a punt return end at #16 Ole Miss last year, a span of 28 games. Prior to a two-yard return by Rebel Micah Davis, the last one came in a 45-19 road win over Miss. State on Nov. 12, 2022 when Zavion Thomas took one 63 yards for a score.

*Georgia allowed its first significant punt return since 2022 when Boo Carter (Tennessee) posted a 26-yarder last year and was promptly tackled to save a TD by Thorson. Opponents tallied 57 yards on 11 PR last year.

*With Thorson out for the CFP last year, Georgia turned to then true freshman **Drew Miller** in the Sugar Bowl. In his debut, he had four punts for a 39.8 average with a long of 48.

He's made all 119 PATs too. *His 91.3 FG% in 2024 ranked 2nd in the SEC and 3rd best in Georgia history. *Team-leading 111 points in 2024, going 21-for-23 on FGs (both misses from 50+), 48-for-48 on PATs and handling kickoffs too (80 of 85 overall with a 63.7 avg.). Made his first nine FGs in 2024 before a 55-yard miss against MSU, then made eight straight until missing a 53-yarder in the win versus Ga. Tech.

The experienced kickoff returners include graduate **Cash Jones** (4-for-58 yards in 2024) along with USC transfer junior **Zachariah Branch** (Career: 29-for-547 yards, 1 TD). At punt returner, Branch has done this as well during his days with the Trojans (23-for-406 yards, 1 TD). In 203, Branch won The Jet Award for the nation's top returner.

Junior transfer OLB **Elo MODOZIE** blocked a field goal attempt by Rice and Notre Dame in 2024 while playing for Army. Senior transfer DB **Adrian Maddox** blocked a field goal attempt by Prairie View A&M in 2022 while playing for Alabama State. Georgia's last blocked field goal came in 2024 by Dan Jackson against Auburn. He is now with the Detroit Lions on IR.

What does Kirby Smart and Knute Rockne have in common? They registered their 100th career win in just 117 games! That ranks as the fifth fastest in NCAA FBS history behind Gil Dobie (108), George Woodruff (109), Bud Wilkinson (111) and Fielding Yost (114).

During Georgia's 31-game home winning streak, the Bulldogs have beaten 10 ranked teams including No. 1 Tennessee in 2022, No. 7 Tennessee in 2024, No. 7 Auburn in 2020, No. 8 Kentucky in 2021 and No. 9 Ole Miss in 2023.

Academic & Community Service In The Smart Era

* The University of Georgia ranked No. 18 in *U.S. News & World Report's* 2025 ranking of the best public universities in the nation, marking the ninth consecutive year that UGA has placed in the top 20.

*The 2025 Bulldogs feature 11 players who will wear the "SEC Graduate" patch on their uniform during the regular season: **Liam Badger, Dillon Bell, Luke Bennett, Oscar Delp, Elijah Greene III, Cash Jones, Gunner Stockton, Beau Gardner** (UCLA), **Josh McCray** (Illinois), **Micah Morris** and **Brett Thorson**.

* A total of 290 players have made the SEC Academic Honor Roll including a high of 48 from the 2024 team.

* Under Smart, Bulldogs have been named National Football Foundation (NFF) Hampshire Society Members 19 times. The society is comprised of football players from all divisions who maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or better in their career, were starters or significant contributors and have completed their final year of eligibility. The most recent members were **Beau Gardner** and Charlie Ham.

* Ladd McConkey, a 2nd round pick of the L.A. Chargers in 2024, became the 15th Bulldog since 1966 to be named a Campbell Trophy finalist and NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award winner. He received an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship. Georgia leads the SEC and is tied for sixth nationally with its 15 honorees.

* Members of the football team play in the annual Bulldogs Battling Breast Cancer charity golf tournament during the summer. It has raised more than \$2 million since the event began in 2004. This year, former Bulldog and NFL standout Jordan Jenkins is donating \$100 per sack that the Bulldogs record in 2025.

* In the area of community service in 2024, Malaki Starks became the 24th Bulldog since 1992 to earn a spot on the AFCA Good Works Team, which honors 22 men annually. Georgia's 24 recipients leads the nation.

*In October of 2023 and 2024, the team participated in the Chick-fil-A Dawg Bowl. It was led by former Bulldog coach Mark Richt and raised more than \$750,000 each year for Parkinson's and Crohn's disease.

* In September of 2020, it was announced that Kirby and Mary Beth Smart contributed \$1 million to UGA and the Athletic Association's new social justice program, scholarships for senior athletes whose seasons were affected by the pandemic and the expansion of the football program.

- 13 Bulldogs were selected in the 2025 NFL draft including three in the first round.

Dooley Field At Sanford Stadium Quick Facts

*Named for the late Dr. S. V. Sanford, former president of the University and Chancellor of the University system

*An overflow crowd of 30,000 saw the stadium's first game on October 12, 1929, when Yale University made its only trip South. Georgia won the now famous game when a young sophomore end from Macon, Vernon "Catfish" Smith, scored all 15 of the Bulldogs' points. Final score, Georgia 15, Yale 0.

*Through the years, the stadium has experienced various projects including adding lights at field level, double-decking the stands, closing in the West End, building SkySuites on both sides, work to Reed Plaza and renovating the West End Zone.

*Sanford Stadium played host to the medal round of the 1996 Olympic men's and women's soccer, watched by over 3 billion people around the world on television.

*Prior to Georgia's 2019 home opener, the playing field at Sanford Stadium was formally renamed in honor of Vince Dooley, the Bulldogs' all-time winningest head coach. Dooley served as head football coach of the Bulldogs from 1964 through 1988 and director of athletics from 1979 to 2004. As head coach, he won 201 games, one national championship and six SEC championships. While Dooley was athletic director, UGA won 23 national championships and 78 SEC team championships.

*The latest development was a two-year project completed in 2024 that featured a new press box, additional premium seating, restrooms, concessions and expanded concourse on the 100-level south side. It raised capacity to 93,033.

Mascot Facts And More About Uga XI, a.k.a "Boom"

*Georgia's Uga has established himself as the nation's most well-known mascot. The line of pure white English bulldogs, which epitomizes everything Georgia, has been owned by the Frank W. "Sonny" Seiler family of Savannah, Ga., since Uga I first graced the campus in 1956.

*Following the retirement of Uga X, 10-month old puppy Boom assumed the vaunted role of Georgia's on-field mascot in 2023. Currently, Uga XI is in his third season with a career record of 24-4.

*Boom is the 11th solid white English Bulldog to serve as Georgia's mascot since the line began in 1956 courtesy of the Seiler family of Savannah. In his first season, Boom saw the Bulldogs post their third-consecutive undefeated regular season and ended the year with a record-breaking 63-3 victory over FSU in the Orange Bowl to finish 13-1. In 2024, Georgia captured its 15th SEC title and advanced to the College Football Playoff where it fell to No. 5 Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl to cap an 11-3 year. In the offseason, Boom resides with his family in Savannah.

*Through the years, Uga has been defined by his spiked collar, a symbol of the position which he holds. He was given his name, an abbreviation for the university, by William Young of Columbus, a law school classmate of Seiler. Each of the Uga mascots is awarded a varsity letter in the form of a plaque, identical to those presented to all Bulldog athletes who letter in their respective sports.

*As determined and published by the *Pitt Press*, the University of Georgia is the only major college that actually buries its mascots within the confines of the stadium. Ugas I-IX are buried in marble vaults near the main gate in the embankment of the South stands. Epitaphs to the dogs are inscribed in bronze, and before each home game, flowers are placed on their graves.

*For the past 20 years, Uga's jerseys have been custom-made at the beginning of each season from the same material used for the players' jerseys. Old jerseys are destroyed.

*Uga's on-field home is a permanent air conditioned doghouse located next to the cheerleader's platform, providing comfort in the heat of August and September. The custom-made doghouse is a gift from the Bahamian Bulldog Club of Nassau, Bahamas, through the courtesy of Fred Hazlewood.
